Word is spreading about the OhioRISE program! During a multisystem youth program meeting with ODM, a Department of Education (DOE) staff member reported the following:

“When interviewing parents and guardians for a complaint investigation, I had several grandparents tell me they had been contacted by OhioRISE. The grandparents reported being very happy about the program and feeling like there was actually ‘help’ available for once. Interestingly, they reported having raised multiple grandchildren, nieces, and nephews throughout the years and this was the first time they felt supported. They also felt like they had clear direction on how to help the children they were caring for.”

Impact Spotlight Continued

The Child and Adolescent Behavioral Health Center of Excellence (COE) is Working Hard to Train Ohio's System of Care Workforce!

From March – July 2022, 1,157 individuals have been trained in Moderate Care Coordination (MCC) or Intensive Care Coordination (ICC).

- Training participants learn the foundations of care coordination as well as the practice framework for ICC or MCC.
- Since July 2022, 363 individuals have been trained in care coordination facilitation skills.
- Effective facilitation skills are a core competency for care coordinators. Training participants gain essential knowledge and practice in facilitation skills.

Since January 2022, 2,308 individuals have been trained in the Ohio Children's Initiative Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS) assessment tool.

- Training participants develop their knowledge in transformational collaborative outcomes management (TCOM) and the CANS. Participants are encouraged, but not required, to pursue Ohio CANS assessor certification.
