# PRTF Guiding Principles

- PRTF is one service on a continuum of care for youth with complex needs
- Trauma-focused, culturally and linguistically competent care
- Individualized, collaborative, and intensive interdisciplinary treatment
- Strength based and evidence-based treatment
- Quickly stabilize youth behaviors and address symptoms to allow return to community in as short of a time-frame as possible
- Non-coercive care environment
- Youth and family engagement is key component
- Shared decision-making between youth, family and treatment TEAM
- Strengthen and expand the youth and family's community connections and natural supports
- Develop and retain competent PRTF workforce
- Data collection and analysis to demonstrate outcomes and identify any areas for improvement

# OhioRISE Rate Setting Commitment

- Establishing rates for the new/enhanced package of OhioRISE services is a critical stage of our work
- We understand OhioRISE:
  - » Requires simultaneous implementation of several new and enhanced services
  - » Draws on the same workforce to implement many of the new/enhanced services
- PRTF rates need to be set within the context of the continuum of care
  - » To be able to serve children who demonstrate a need for PRTF/inpatient level of care that is not typically available in Ohio today
  - » In context of children and youth who will receive services in homes, residential settings, and inpatient levels of care, and understanding some providers/agencies serve:
    - Children and youth who have multiple levels of needs
    - Children and youth who reside in multiple types of treatment settings
- With the points above in mind, ODM is committed to setting service rates for the program:
  - » Understandably
  - » Transparently
  - » Sustainably

# PRTF Regulations

- PRTF services are optional State plan services authorized under §1905(a)(16) of the Social Security Act
- Code of Federal Regulations requirements for PRTFs
  - § 441.151 through § 441.184 - Inpatient Psychiatric Services for Individuals Under Age 21 in Psychiatric Facilities or Programs
  - § 483.350 through § 483.376 - Condition of Participation for the Use of Restraint or Seclusion in Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities Providing Inpatient Psychiatric Services for Individuals Under Age 21
- Draft OAC rules:
  - 5122-41 PRTF facilities
  - 5160-59-03.6 PRTF services
  - 5160-59-07 PRTF cost reports

# Common PRTF Rate Setting Payment Methodologies

- Below is an overview of common per diem PRTF rate methodology approaches
  - Statewide average
  - Statewide average peer groups (e.g., bed count, types of services by the facility, geographic regions, etc.)
  - Provider specific
- Per diem rates may include ancillary services or they can be paid outside of the per diem

**ODM anticipates a statewide average or statewide average with peer groups for the Year 1 and Year 2 PRTF rates and will solicit feedback from stakeholders to finalize the payment methodology**

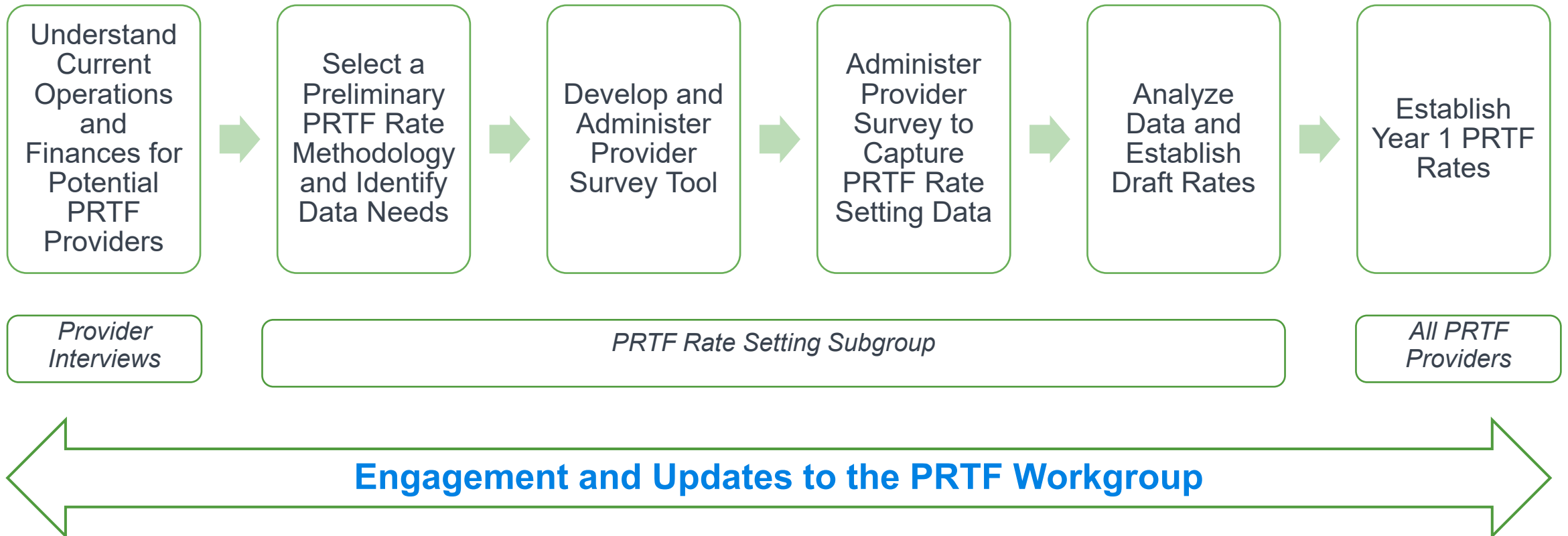

# Provider Survey and Cost Report

- Initial PRTF rates will be informed by anticipated future PRTF costs and operation standards
- Milliman is reviewing the Ohio Title IV-E cost reports to identify usable information about current residential treatment service costs and staffing
- Milliman will use provider interviews to better understand the anticipated costs associated with PRTF service delivery, and the extent to which those costs are currently reflected in the Title IV-E cost report or other available sources
- Provider interviews and data collection will include both in-state and out-of-state potential PRTF providers

# PRTF Workgroup and Subgroup Roles and Responsibilities

## PRTF Workgroup

**Role:** Reviews draft rates (year 1) and other PRTF Rate Setting Subgroup outcomes

**Participants:** PRTF Workgroup members, including all potential Ohio PRTFs

**Meeting frequency:** Quarterly (or as necessary)

## PRTF Rate Setting Subgroup

**Role:** Provides informed recommendations on the rate setting methodology, provider survey, research, and cost report

**Participants:** Up to 10 potential PRTF providers that can provide technical feedback about PRTF finances and operations

**Meeting frequency:** Monthly

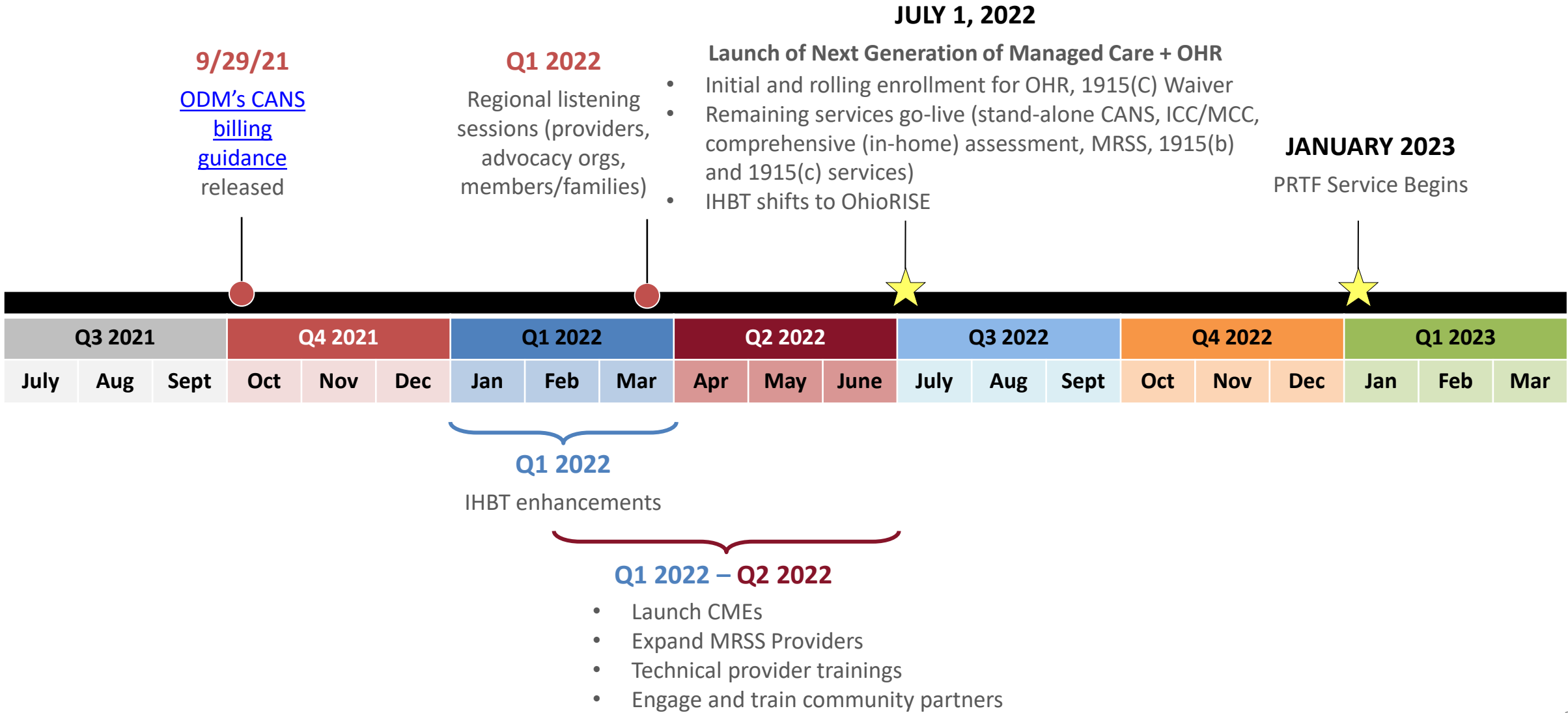
- Complete provider interviews

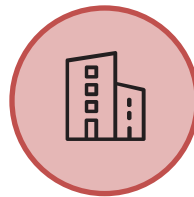
# Ohio Medicaid's OhioRISE Transition Grants Announcement

## Maintaining and expanding Mobile Response and Stabilization Services (MRSS)

- Grant funds will continue **supporting existing providers** until OhioRISE goes live and assist in **standing up new providers**

## Support for grantees to build the System of Care in their communities across the state

- Aetna will **build relationships** with CMEs and MRSS providers while sparking their work to **develop the System of Care in Ohio communities**
